Krystelle Jean-Michel graduated from Southern Illinois University Carbondale in 2008 after earning a bachelor's degree in psychology. As an undergraduate at SIU, she was a member of the University Honors Program, the Acculturation Research Team and also served as a resident assistant and a teaching assistant for Psychology 101. Jean-Michel pursued her doctoral degree in counseling psychology from Western Michigan University where she was awarded the Thurgood Marshall Graduate Fellowship. Jean-Michel's dissertation topic, "Exploring Help-Seeking Intentions of Black American Church-goers," focused on exploring the attitudes and intentions of Black American church-goers toward seeking counseling services. Her dissertation was successfully defended in June 2013.

Prior to completing her academic pursuits, she served over three years active duty as a non-commissioned officer in the United States Army. Jean-Michel has clinical experiences with military personnel, veterans, and college student population. She has extensive training in administering evidence-based assessments and treatments for a variety of disorders to include anxiety disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), major depressive disorder, and substance abuse. Jean-Michel served as a licensed psychologist with the 509th Medical Operations Squadron, Mental Health Flight. She worked to prevent, diagnose and treat a myriad of mental health conditions. She also served as the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment (ADAPT) program manager. Jean-Michel provided effective education, identification, assessment, treatment programs, and prevention services for installation.

Jean-Michel's clinical interests include: PTSD, trauma treatment, and inpatient psychiatry. Her research interests and experiences include: health disparities, help-seeking among ethnic minorities, and cross-cultural psychology. Currently, Jean-Michel is an assistant professor at the United States Air Force Academy where she teaches undergraduates and mentors students in the performance of capstone related projects.
