Born in Detroit, Johnson attended Tougaloo College in Jackson, Miss. He earned his Juris Doctorate (JD) from South Texas College of Law in Houston. He has furthered his training through fellowships with the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, the George Washington University School of Political Management, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He has served as an annual guest lecturer at Harvard Law School, and as an adjunct professor at Tougaloo College.
